




and Now Works to Help Others Do the Same

We all know the words no one ever wants to hear: "You have cancer." But what do you do upon hearing them? What can you do even if you never have?

Beth Fisher was 25 when those words were first whispered to her. A new mom to her then not quite 2-year-old daughter, Olivia, she sat down to a dial-up internet connection to search "leukemia." Her oncologist confirmed there was no cure. The only course of action would be a Bone Marrow Transplant, but the odds of survival were grim.

Twenty years later, Beth remains both cancer-free and an active volunteer with The Leukemia and Lymphoma Society (LLS). Before moving to Grand Rapids in 2016, she and Olivia lived in Fort Wayne, Indiana, for 17 years. It was there that not only Beth met her husband, Ryan, but the local LLS Chapter approached her to run for "Woman of the Year." Having never heard of the nationwide

Man and Woman of the Year (MWOY) campaign, Beth quickly researched it and almost as quickly realized she could not say no.

Today, Beth is the local Chair of the MWOY campaign for West Michigan. Man and Woman of the Year is an elite 10-week philanthropic campaign to raise money on behalf of LLS, who is at the forefront of the fight to cure cancer. LLS is the largest funder of cutting-edge research to advance cures not only for blood cancers, but all cancers. More than 1.2 billion has been invested in research by LLS, including breakthroughs in immunotherapy, genomics and personalized medicine. This research is saving lives! Revolutionary new treatments originally discovered through blood cancer research are now being tested in clinical trials for other cancers.

In an effort to fund this pivotal research, hundreds of men and women in cities across America participate in MWOY. As part of an exclusive nomination process, local leaders, those who have been affected by cancer, or people who have a heart and penchant for the greater good are contacted by members of the local West Michigan LLS Leadership Team. Upon acceptance of the nomination, candidates begin fundraising. In MWOY, every dollar counts as one vote. The male and female candidate with the most votes are named the local Chapter's Man and Woman of the Year, and their totals are then considered for the National Title. Additionally, candidates who raise \$50,000 or more qualify for a research naming rights opportunity.

The 10-week campaign kicks off every year in late February and culminates with a black tie optional Grand Finale Gala. This year's event will take place May 9 in at the JW Marriott Ballroom at 6 p.m. Guests can purchase tickets to the event to support their candidate and participate in the live and silent auctions.



to make more memories with his teammates. "I love the team aspect during school season. It makes the season much more fun and exciting!" Hier exclaimed.



A home circa 1973 is typically not one we'd think to feature in a House of the Month due to age...but this comfortable home is older only in structure. The entire interior has been dramatically transformed by its current owners over the last several months. The metamorphosis has turned the well-known 70s colors of olive, mustard, brown, and florals to much more current, warm, neutral tones.

It was a labor of love for Matthew and Whitney Swartz, who moved into their Cascade home as relative newlyweds in April of 2018. They had been looking all over Ada, Forest Hills, and Lowell. They'd also considered building but determined that in the current market, they'd be able to get more value and have more potential if they could find the vision in an existing home (I would agree). This four-bedroom, two-bathroom home decidedly had "good bones," and was small enough to manage yet large enough to give them room to grow a family...no kids or pets yet, but that's the plan! 



By day, Marla Bader is a mother of two, works out at Fit Body Boot Camp, manages global programs, and, in the fall of 2016, built her first backyard-shed. Dubbed a She-Shed by her Oliver Woods neighbors, it spans less than 200 square feet and is a testimony to the kind of person Marla is - hardworking, determined, and entirely capable of anything she puts her mind to.







Outerwear:

- · As a general rule, if your dog will only be outside for 10 minutes or less, they typically do not need any clothing.
- Once temperatures drop under 20° F, all owners need to be aware that their dogs could potentially develop cold-associated health problems like hypothermia and frostbite. Watch for signs, including shivering, anxiety, and slowing down. Beware of the wind chill factor.
- · Double-coated dogs such as Siberian Huskies and Newfoundlanders are very unlikely to need clothing.
- · Shorter-haired breeds, senior dogs, puppies and dogs with medical conditions do benefit from the additional warmth.
- · Pets with diabetes, heart disease, kidney disease, or hormonal imbalances (such as Cushing's disease) may have a harder time regulating their body temperature, and may be more susceptible to problems from temperature extremes.

Paw Protection:

One of the biggest threats to healthy paw pads is the salt used to melt ice on driveways, roads and sidewalks. Prolonged contact with deicers can lead to chemical burns on dog paws. Use pet-friendly salt, and cover your dog's paws when out on walks with paw wax or booties.

- · Booties offer the best protection: Options include rubber-sole styles with double Velcro straps, waterproof nylon socks, and disposable rubbers.
- For elderly dogs who are more prone to slipping and falling on ice, you may wish to try booties with a grip.

Bed Warmers for Arthritic Pets:

If your feline friend or canine companion is elderly and/or suffers from arthritis you may wish to offer a heated orthopedic bed.

West Michigan Youth Ballet

What could be better in the world of the arts than experiencing an opulent, full-length ballet that delivers its promise to delight the senses with inspiring music, original choreography, exquisite costuming, and innovative sets? Better is when all the dancers are our children.

For the past 11 years, West Michigan Youth Ballet has produced full-length ballets two times a year: The Nutcracker in December and a different fairy tale in March. The past four seasons have lifted the bar(re) considerably under the leadership of Artistic Director Stephen Sanford, who danced professionally for 17 years. An important reason for the increased excellence of the productions can be traced back to personnel Sanford has brought on board: Associate Artistic Director Samantha Shelton has a storied resume, beginning with the Joffrey Ballet in New York City and including work with ABT for the past 20 years. Like Sanford, she is also a faculty member at Grand Valley State Uni-

versity; and Laura Schwenk-Berman, who danced professionally for 15 years before working as a teacher and choreog rapher at a number of universities, and now works in both Grand Rapids and Chicago. And since the magic can't happen without the right costumes, Heather Cassady, who spent



her professional career working for Disney Studios, creates all those vibrant costumes for the dancers. All of these artists are passionate about working for WMYB. "It's so important for young dancers to have the experience of dancing in a full-length ballet. We feel privileged to be able to provide that opportunity for them," says Sanford.

And just who are these young people? They are the children of West Michigan — from as far north as Traverse City and as far south as Kalamazoo. The dancers come from 11 different studios and GVSU, whose teachers are all willing to help the students learn their pieces. For 17-19 weeks, these 8 to 18-year-olds travel every Sunday to the West Michigan Youth Ballet studios in Ada, Michigan, and more often as a performance nears. And, of course, their dedicated parents make the trip with them. More than 100 volunteers, most of them parents of dancers, help make the ballets run so smoothly. They help with costume construction (The Nutcracker alone used 267 original costumes), performance production, front house management, the gift boutique, which helps audience members to bring memories home, and a delightful high tea before The Nutcracker, which is attended by Characters from the ballet.

The reputation for quality at WMYB continues to grow. The Nu cracker performances at Forest Hills Fine Arts Center were sol out in 2017, so an additional show was added for 2018. Combine with this year's sold-out performance at the Frauenthal Center for the Performing Arts in Muskegon, more than 4,000 people a tended a WMYB performance of The Nutcracker in 2018. That' an impressive audience size at a time in history when so many other distractions are clamoring for our attention.

So what's in store for spring? Cinderella! WMYB produced this ballet four years ago but this year's show will be different. Still based on Prokofiev's timeless music, Laura Berman, who chored graphed large sections of Sleeping Beauty 2 years ago, is creating original choreography for the March 23 shows. "The children love this story," says Sanford. "We have 65 dancers performing all the roles and they are so excited to be dancing this well-love story with all its drama and intrigue. It's a timeless struggle of the journey from feelings of alienation to the joy of finding one's place in life. As our dancers present this work, hopefully, they' grow in understanding their own place in life. Just imagine: a young sprite from four years ago could find herself cast as a fai godmother this spring, building her dreams and meeting her goals as a dancer."

Cinderella will be performed twice on Saturday, March 23, at 1:00 p.m. and 4:30 p.m. at DeVos Center For Arts and Worship on the campus of Grand Rapids Christian High School. It's a beauti-





