





# The Gift of Gab and a Love for Words Lead to Launch of Debut Book

As a young mom at 25, Beth persevered through a successful bone marrow transplant. Today, she is not only surviving, but thriving and sharing her story and insights through one of her many passions-words.

The spoken word comes easily to Beth. Over twenty-five years of working in corporate sales, she has addressed crowds large and small. At one point during her long career journey, she wondered if she could ever even do anything else. Her mom highlighted her obvious gift and calling to her when she said, "Beth, you can speak to one or a thousand people without thinking a thing of it. I could never do that, I'd throw up!" Beth was confused at how that could be since it was simply what came naturally to her. The gift of gab as some may say, but Beth's gift is deeply bolstered with experience, reflection, faith, authenticity and inspiration.

The written word comes easily to Beth as well. Two years ago, she began writing more than her usual blogs, newspaper columns and magazine article contributions. Beth has always enjoyed writing even from a young age and wanted to write a book for as long as she can remember, but never had time with a crazy busy life of family, work, travel, education (she has two master's) and volunteering. With this impetus of recording her experiences, a theme and a resurfaced dream emerged. Voraciously she continued to pour out her heart and mind on her computer. Before she knew it, she had 27,000 words and musings organized into 17 chapters. During a writing seminar this past summer, Suzanne Brooks-Kuhn who founded Brookstone Creative Group and Publishing, met with Beth and encouraged her to keep formulating her message. "I would listen to you and your message, as would my millennial daughters. Let's get you to the finish line."

And finish she did!

Remorseless: Learning to Lose Labels, Expectations, and Assumptions-Without Losing Yourself was introduced onto bookshelves and online last week. Learning to make decisions based on "who you were created to be as opposed to succumbing to bad decisions based on what others think" has been an evolving topic through Beth's life experiences, good and bad. Through delightful laugh-out-loud stories, and insightful life examples, Beth brings readers to a place of examining their own life and pondering how this applies to them.

"I am convinced that if we saw ourselves as God sees us, we'd avoid so many bad decisions," she says. "Labels do not allow for the beautiful differences and nuances that exist within each individual."



Beth's daughter, Olivia, was not quite 2 years old when her mom was diagnosed with leukemia. Beth has worked tirelessly with the Leukemia & Lymphoma Society over the years. As Beth can attest, that mission has allowed her to see Olivia, now 23, grow up.



In addition to providing documentation of medications, veterinary info, condition details, routines and feeding habits, you will also want to supply an advanced directive that spells out what kind of emergency procedures you authorize in your absence. Ensuring the provision of extra blankets, incontinence products, walking mats and heated bedding will help keep your pet comfortable.

If you choose a licensed boarding facility, ask if there is an area designed for seniors, which is an emerging trend in the industry. Features such as an area located away from main stay and play areas, extra soundproofing, raised beds, extra-bedding, and increased monitoring create an improved experience.

For example, Whiskers Pet Spa and Resort is launching its "Villas" wing later this spring, designed to cater to senior pets. Another option is boarding with an animal hospital that also provides geriatric treatments such as hydrotherapy, acupuncture or cold laser therapy. Grand Rapids is fortunate to have several boarding facilities of this type, such as Cascade Hospital for Animals.

Other pet parents may be more inclined to seek trustworthy "in-home pet care providers" who either offer up their homes for overnight stays or come to your home. Resources available include the "Air BNB" of the pet world, Rover.com, or in-home pet sitting services. Dr. Brush recommends doing due diligence and asking specifically about caregivers' experience with senior pets, checking references, and asking if the caregiver is bonded and insured. Trial stays will help your fur friend feel comfortable and help determine if the arrangement is the right fit before considering an extended trip.

Whichever type of boarding experience you choose, thoughtful preparation will help take the stress out of spring vacation for both you and your senior pet.







# Lizzie Agee Making Purple Matter: Raising Awareness and Funding for The Epilepsy Foundation of Michigan

Lizzie Agee is a senior at Northpointe Christian High School, a baton twirler, and a cheerleader. She also has epilepsy. Each seizure wipes out an entire day for Lizzie. They result in memory loss and complete exhaustion. They have caused her to miss school and at one point kept her from getting her license. While epilepsy is a central part of her life, it does not define her.

Lizzie loves to dance on her cheer team and as a baton twirler. In her free time, she paints to relax. Her family also has a farm up north where together they enjoy their horses, snowmobile and kayak. A Vikings fan, Lizzie enjoys watching football with her family.

Lizzie's epilepsy has played an integral part in bringing her closer to her family. The struggle of epilepsy has been a source of bonding between Lizzie's two brothers and her parents. Her mom, Kathy Agee, has been Lizzie's rock throughout her entire journey with epilepsy. A biology major and a teacher, Kathy took it upon herself to sift through medical journals and articles to try to find something to help manage Lizzie's symptoms. They tried all different kinds of medicines with unfortunate side effects. With Kathy's research, they were able to manage Lizzie's epilepsy on a cellular level with a common energy supplement for Coenzyme Q10.

When Lizzie was 14 years old, she started to experience uncontrollable arm spasms each morning. Her arms would jerk randomly and she'd drop her hairbrush. Though scary at times, they assumed the spasms were just a symptom of tired muscles and didn't worry too much about them. Then, the summer before her freshman year, Lizzie, her mom, and her best friend all went on a trip to New York. One morning, as they were getting ready for the day, Lizzie experienced her very first grand mal seizure. Lizzie's best friend kept her safe and reassured her and they got on the plane back to Grand Rapids. They went from the airport to the ER where they expected to be told that she had a concussion. Instead, they were referred to Helen DeVos

Children's Hospital. After EEGs and a couple of weeks, Lizzie and her mom were informed that Lizzie had juvenile myoclonic epilepsy; a kind of epilepsy that starts roughly when someone is 14 years old. Considering that there was no family history of epilepsy, they were not expecting that diagnosis.

Two years after she was diagnosed, Lizzie looked up epilepsy events and found a hockey game for epilepsy awareness. From there, her involvement in the community flowered. Every year there are epilepsy strolls to help raise awareness and funds for the Epilepsy Foundation of Michigan. Lizzie couldn't attend a summer cheer camp last year and there her cheer team came up with an epilepsy awareness football game where the cheerleaders wore purple bows and the football players wore purple socks. Purple, the color of epilepsy awareness. Lizzie spoke at the assembly for the football game as well as at an epilepsy stroll.

Lizzie has since received her driver's license after being six months seizure-free. After high school, she plans to take a gap year and work at Springhill Summer Camp as a counselor and do missionary work until she enrolls in the MSU business program as a marketing major. Lizzie's dream job is to work in marketing for the Epilepsy Foundation where she can help spread positive change and awareness.

# Mel Trotter Ministries

Mel Trotter Ministries exists to demonstrate the compassion of Jesus Christ, through rescue and restoration for anyone experiencing hunger and homelessness. It all started in 1899 when city leaders in Grand Rapids discovered an influx of lost and addicted individuals. They called the Pacific Garden Rescue Mission in Chicago for help, and Melvin E. Trotter, a former hopeless alcoholic, was called upon to start the Grand Rapids City Mission in 1900. In his 40 years of running the Mission, Mel Trotter tapped many others to help start 68 more Rescue Missions across the country.

Mel Trotter Ministries (MTM) has served the greater Grand Rapids area for 120 years. The organization is uniquely positioned for growth in five key areas: Strategy, Sustainability, Partnership and Collaboration, Excellence, and Faith. Housing objectives and strategies have been outlined for each of these growth areas. MTM's "Vision 2020" plan also identifies key performance measures that will be used to track and evaluate progress. Vision 2020 is a dynamic, ongoing effort. Many exciting changes are underway as Mel Trotter Ministries adjusts to new circumstances and opportunities. However, the one thing that will never change is MTM's commitment to Christ and His people.

Speaking of God's people—who does that include, you may ask. "Everyone. We are not here to serve people based on what we think they should look, act, or think like. We are called to demonstrate the compassion of Christ and offer services and hope to any human being who comes here," said Dennis Van Kampen, President and CEO. "People are worth immeasurably more."

To that end, "Immeasurably More" is Mel Trotter Ministries' unifying theme. It is MTM's vision, and the framework that holds their donors, staff, guests and work together. It echoes the entire mission and is confirmed not only in people but in programming and recent efforts.

After two years of negotiating with competing health systems, Mel Trotter is launching free medical clinics onsite. The Mission has had dental, vision, chiropractic, and RN's onsite for many years; however, now there are physicians as well through partnerships with Spectrum Health, Mercy Health Saint Mary's, Michigan State University Medical School, and Grand Valley State University Health Systems.

MTM, who announced a merger with Heartside Ministry in January of this year, has also entered into a deep partnership with Next Step, a ministry that employs returning citizens from jails and prisons. Next Step teaches the skills they need to be laborers, construction workers, and craftsmen. Rundown houses were purchased from the City off the tax rolls, then turned right around and totally renovated by Next Step employees—ultimately restoring the once unlivable houses into habitable and welcoming homes. Along with purchasing the homes as part of its programming, Mel Trotter helped almost 600 men, women and children find permanent housing in 2019. Past data shows that once families find permanent living, 80% of them do not return to the mission.

Additionally, in 2019, 269 men and women found permanent fulltime jobs, and 207 came to faith. You see, while Mel Trotter Ministries has existed since 1900—they know people have existed and been loved for even longer. Regardless of differences. Regardless of the circumstances. Regardless of experiences. And certainly regardless of where they came from.

MTM believes that "immeasurably more" means just that—we cannot measure or quantify the unconditional love God has for each of us. Nor can we fully understand our worth and value, especially in the midst of hardship. As we are each made in the same image of God, we must hold each other's pain in our hearts.

The Mission's hope is that every person who walks through its doors would come to know they are made for immeasurably more. Mel Trotter continues to exist today to demonstrate that understanding—through faith-filled relationships, programming, and accountability with homeless individuals and families which leads to changed behaviors, and ultimately, restored lives.

And they do it, all while remaining steadfast to their unifying framework and vision, one first stated thousands of years ago by a man named Paul—who was also at one time lost before someone stepped in to help him see the light. "Now to him who is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine, according to his power that is at work within us, to him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus throughout all generations, forever and ever! Amen." (Eph. 3:20-21).

In March 2017, the School of Social Policy & Practice at the University of Pennsylvania released a two-year study that revealed a quantitative relationship between the presence of cultural resources in a neighborhood and key aspects of social wellbeing. Low- and middle-income demographics with more access to the arts experience better education, security, and health outcomes. The benefits of arts education programs in schools are too numerous to list but include improved academic performance, better decision-making skills, focus, teamwork, and student accountability. Grand Rapids' local opera company is listening to the research.

Opera Grand Rapids (OGR), Michigan's oldest and longest-running professional opera company, announced January 31 the creation of a new Community Tickets Program. The company is prepared to give away up to 900 seats to its spring production of Puccini's Turandot May 1/2 at DeVos Performance Hall. OGR hopes that a focus on outreach and inclusion will not only strengthen the community but also strengthen the opera company. "I don't know of many performing arts organizations that succeed by excluding large swaths of the community," said OGR Executive Director Emilee Syrewicze. "We want to eliminate all barriers for people in West Michigan to experience opera," she continued.

The company is investing roughly \$40,000 into the program and is partnering with local community groups to distribute the tickets. Unlike similar programs in performing arts organizations nationwide, OGR's program will give ticket-holders prime seating. "We don't want to relegate community ticket-holders to the worst seats in the house. That defeats the purpose of equity and inclusion," said Diane St. Claire, president of the OGR Board of Directors.

The free tickets are available through partner organizations and are restricted to individuals who are not previous OGR ticket holders. The organizations partnering with OGR include (but are not limited to): Grandville Avenue Arts & Humanities,



Grand Rapids Public Library, Salvation Army of Kent County, Woodlands/Suburban Library Cooperative, Grand Rapids Urban League and Community Food Club. OGR is still accepting partner organizations and program sponsors and the program is firstcome, first-serve.
